Bradley Baker, 73, passed away peacefully into his Savior's arms, on April 13, 2020. Brad was born in Lake City, Tennessee, on September 5, 1946, the son of the late Edward and Mary Hubbard Baker.

Brad was a Veteran who served two tours in Vietnam while enlisted in the United States Navy. He graduated from Tennessee Tech University with a BS Degree in Chemistry and at age 70 earned his Master's Degree. Brad was well known as a brilliant chemist who worked for several textile companies. He later founded Alko America where he developed and patented several products which are still being manufactured and distributed across the country.

Brad coached both Scott and Chris in baseball and soccer for several years and also served as President of the Weddington Athletic Association. He was a family man with a passion for God's Word and for teaching others about Jesus. He was a member of Shiloh Baptist Church where he loved teaching the Senior Men's Sunday School class until his health failed. Brad was loved by everyone whose path he crossed. Brad was a member of Monroe Masonic Lodge #244, a Yorkrite Mason and also was a member of Monroe Chapter #113 Order of the Eastern Star where he held several offices including Worthy Patron.
