



Janice King Plumley

June 8, 1934 - October 24, 2019

Billie Janice King Plumley (Jan) passed away on Thursday October 24, 2019 at the age of 85, surrounded by those who loved her. She was born on June 8, 1934 in Cherokee County and grew up in Marble, NC. She is survived by her loving husband of 64 years, Robert Thomas Plumley (Bob), their three children, David Plumley and wife Carol; Steven Plumley; Elizabeth Plumley Robinson and husband Alfonso Robinson; her three grandchildren, Travis Plumley and wife Lauren; Marisa Robinson; Ali Robinson; and 4 great grandchildren. Preceding her in death was her beloved grandson, Christopher Plumley.

Jan grew up on a farm in the North Carolina Mountains. Although she moved to Charlotte, NC around the age of 20, she was and would always be a country girl at heart. She met Bob while working at Sears Roebuck in Charlotte. Their journey together as husband and wife began on January 7, 1956. Jan was an avid reader, always wanting to learn something from what she was reading, and her desire to understand the Bible was no exception. For many years she was searching to find answers to her questions. After studying several different religions, talking with different religious leaders and getting no answers, Jehovah's Witnesses showed up at her door. An in-depth study of the Bible thus ensued. A year later on July 11, 1969, she and her husband Bob were baptized at the International Convention of Jehovah's Witnesses in Atlanta, GA. Due to her diligent study and desire to know her Heavenly Father Jehovah, and His Son Christ Jesus, she was able to help in teaching her children and grandchildren the 'Truth'. One of her favorite scriptures was 3 John 4; "No greater joy do I have than this: that I should hear that my children go on walking in the truth."

Along with being a faithful servant of Jehovah for many years, Jan had a love of music and language. She taught herself how to play the piano

at any early age and learned how to play guitar from her husband, Bob. Playing the guitar and singing together was a favorite pas-time of theirs. In her early seventies, she taught herself how to read and speak Spanish. She never wanted to stop learning new things and she would pass everything she learned and loved on to those in her family. She was thrilled to have a granddaughter share her passion for books and the other granddaughter inherit her love for music and playing guitar. Her grandchildren, who referred to her as 'Mama Jan' and 'Grandmother' were the light of her life. She was an excellent playmate, companion, cook, music teacher, story teller – an all-around fun-loving grandmother, always making time for her four grandchildren.

We all long for the day to see her big smile and pretty blue eyes when she hears Jesus' voice and is resurrected back to life in a beautiful Paradise on earth. (John 5:28,29; Ps 37:29) She looked forward to seeing her grandmother, "Mama", in the New World and working with her in a garden. We too look forward to that promise and it's just around the corner!
