John David Brady, devoted husband, father, and brother passed away on Sunday, February 28, 2021 at the age of 55.

John was born on March 26, 1965 in Monroe, Louisiana to John David and Carol Collison Brady. He grew up in Marshfield, Massachusetts and went on to receive a degree in business from the University of Massachusetts Amherst, graduating in 1987. John built a distinguished career as a Managing Director in Corporate and Commercial Banking, which lasted for more than thirty years. He married Margaret (Margi) Rita Mog on September 23, 1989, and together they raised three wonderful children: Matthew, Megan, and Timothy.

John had a passion for sports, particularly basketball, hockey, lacrosse and golf.
